If you are preparing to file a DOL claim, it's important to know the differences between the two parts of this act to understand what compensation you are eligible for and how you can access additional benefits over time.

<p>Compensation Lump sum of \$150,000 and payment of medical expenses from the date a claim is filed.</p>	<p>Compensation Variable payments of up to \$250,000 determined by each individual's impairment rating. \$2500 in compensation for each 1% of impairment.</p>
<p>Who is Eligible</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Department of Energy (DOE) employees • DOE contractor and sub-contractor employees • Beryllium vendor employees • Atomic weapons employees • Underground nuclear weapons test site employees who worked at least 250 days 	<p>Who is Eligible</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Department of Energy (DOE) employees • DOE contractor and sub-contractor employees • Uranium miners, millers and ore transporters covered by Section 5 of the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act (RECA)
<p>Covered Conditions & Illnesses Part B coverage is limited to individuals with cancer, chronic beryllium disease, or silicosis.</p>	<p>Covered Conditions & Illnesses Part E coverage can apply to any diagnosed illness that is a result of toxic exposure to chemicals, solvents, acids or metals. Note: An individual with an approved Part B claim may also be eligible for additional compensation under Part E through the Impairment Rating process.</p>
<p>Approval Requirements Part B claims are approved based on the level of Radiation Exposure which is determined in one of two ways:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NIOSH Radiation Dose Reconstruction • Special Exposure Cohort (SEC) 	<p>Approval Requirements Plan E claims are approved based on a determination that the toxic exposure on site is at least as likely as not to have caused the individual's illness. Having a physician letter stating this can be critical in Plan E claims approvals.</p>
