The Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program (EEOICPA) was established in 2000 to address the illnesses of those who worked on the Department of Energy's Nuclear Weapons Program and were exposed to radiation and toxic chemicals as part of their employment. EEOICPA provides compensation and medical benefits to current and former nuclear weapons workers including DOE employees, contractors and sub-contractors who have suffered an illness due to their work-related exposure.

## **EEOICPA Part B & Part E**

There are two eligibility options under EEOICPA. While the financial benefits for Part B & Part E differ, they both provide similar health benefits including access to necessary home-based care. Individuals and their survivors can file for benefits under both Parts B & E with for a maximum award of \$400,000.

	Part B	Part E
Description:	Provides a lump-sum payment and medical benefits for DOE employees suffering from occupational illnesses incurred as a result of their exposure to radiation, beryllium or silica.	Provides variable amounts of compensation for DOE employees with occupational illnesses that are causally linked to toxic exposures in the DOE or mining work environment.
