Financial Benefits: Eliminate out-of-pocket costs and co-pays for treatments related to consequential illnesses.

Holistic Care Management: By adding consequential illnesses, your care team can better address all your health needs, ensuring you receive the most effective and coordinated treatment possible.

Access to Specialized Services: Some conditions may require specialized treatments, assistive devices, or therapies. Adding these illnesses ensures you're eligible for these critical resources.

Documentation for Future Claims: Keep your medical record up to date to reflect the full scope of your health challenges. This strengthens your case for additional care and services down the road.

- Work with an Advocate: Reach out to a case manager or authorized representative for help navigating the process.
- Talk to Your Doctor: Ensure your physician documents how your new illness is linked to your original work-related condition.
