

Maximizing Your EEOICPA Benefits: Consequential Conditions & Impairment Ratings

To get the most from your EEOICPA White Card benefits, it's important to regularly review your approved conditions, consider any new or worsening health issues, and explore the possibility of *consequential conditions and updated impairment ratings*.

Why You Should Review Your Benefits

As your health changes over time, your White Card should reflect those changes. If you're experiencing new symptoms or complications that may be linked to an already-approved condition, you may qualify to add a **consequential condition**. These are illnesses or injuries that developed as a result of your original covered condition. Adding these conditions can provide access to new types of care, increase compensation, and may qualify you for additional home health support.

The Role of Impairment Ratings

An **Impairment Rating Review** is a key step in determining how much compensation you're entitled to under Part E of the EEOICPA program. If it has been 2 years since your last impairment rating or you've added a new approved or consequential condition, you may be eligible for an updated rating and additional financial compensation.

Recent DOL Updates & Form Requirements:

The Department of Labor has released a newly consolidated form to file a claim for impairment or wage loss, the EE-10. The EE-10 replaces the current EN-10, EN11A, and EN11B forms. The DOL is still in the process of updating the Energy Document Portal with the EE-10 Form. Until that update is complete, claimants may continue to use the EN-10, EN-11A and EN-11B forms when submitting documents via the portal.
