Did you know that as a former Department of Energy worker, you may be eligible for **free medical screenings**? These screenings are offered at no cost to you and can be an important step in identifying work-related illnesses early.

What Are Free Medical Screenings?

Free medical screenings are comprehensive health evaluations. They check for illnesses linked to hazardous exposures on the job, including:

- Respiratory diseases
- Cancers and radiation exposure effects
- Kidney, liver, and neurological issues
- Hearing loss

How Often Are Screenings Available?

You are eligible for **one free screening every one to three years**—even if you've already received one in the past. These can be incredibly valuable even years after your last shift at a DOE site. Your screening and frequency eligibility depends on which nuclear site you worked at.

Who Provides the Screenings?

Screenings are provided by physicians who are familiar with exposures unique to former nuclear workers. CNS Cares can help connect you to the right medical screening program based on your work site.

Why Screenings Matter for Your EEOICPA Claim

Medical screenings can provide documentation of an illness that may be **work-related**—which is a critical part of your **EEOICPA claim**. Screenings can help with:

- **Early detection** of conditions related to toxic exposure

- **Seeking** a specialist if results indicate potential work-related illness
